Dr. Roy Clouser holds an AB from Gordon College, a BD from Reformed Episcopal Seminary, and an MA and PhD from the University of Pennsylvania. Along the way to the PhD he studied with Paul Tillich at Harvard Graduate school and with Herman Dooyeweerd at the Free University of Amsterdam. In 1997 he won one of the Templeton Awards for his course in science and religion. He is the author of *The Myth of Religious Neutrality* (U. of Notre Dame Press, revised 2005), *Knowing with the Heart* (IVP, 1999), and over 20 articles.

ABSTRACT:

Although many Christian thinkers have produced theories about the epistemic status of belief in God, the fact is that the NT has very explicit things to say about that subject which differ from almost all of those theories. I will explain and defend the NT's own view of the subject, citing two other thinkers who also recognized it: Calvin and Pascal.
