WesleyNexus to Sponsor Video Presentation on February 10, 2013.

With the help of a dedicated team of local United Methodists in Montgomery County, Maryland, WesleyNexus is proud to announce the showing of the **Darkwood Brew (www.darkwoodbrew.org)** telecast of **Evolving Universe**, **Evolving Faith** at the Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference Mission Center in Fulton, MD. The program will feature **Dr. Grace Wolf-Chase**, astrophysicist with the Adler Planetarium in Chicago. Dr. Wolf-Chase is a member of the American Astronomical Society, a Founding Member of the Astrobiology Society, and an Affiliated Faculty Member of the Zygon Center for Religion & Science. She is also actively involved with Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), where she has given invited presentations at large gatherings, including a Western States Youth Gathering, a Conference of Bishops, and a Global Mission Event.

Also participating will be the **Reverend Bruce Booher**. Rev. Booher studied astronomy and physics at MIT as an undergraduate and is currently on the Steering Committee of the Lutheran Alliance for Faith, Science and Technology. This committee participates in the inter-denominational Ecumenical Roundtable on Science, Technology and the Church in "engaging, connecting, and communicating good science in our ecumenical church communities".

The host of the program will be **Rev. Eric Elnes** Ph. D. of Countryside Community Church (UCC) in Omaha, NE. Dr. Elnes is the leader of Darkwood Brew, "a groundbreaking interactive web television program and spiritual gathering that explores progressive/emerging Christian faith and values".

The Baltimore-Washington Conference Mission Center is located just south of Columbia, MD off of Route 29 in Fulton, MD. The address is 11711 East Market Place, Fulton, MD. The telecast begins at 6:00 PM EST but space is limited so arrive early to seat.

For those too far from the center to attend, think of hosting your own event. The telecast is free and available on the Darkwood Brew website listed above. Early next year, we will be posting information and materials you can use to host your own event.
